- Continuum of Care (CoC) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)
- Federal competitive grant administered by US Department of Housing and Urban Development
- Washington County Department of Housing Services is the Collaborative Applicant for OR-506CoC
- About \$4 million annually
- Application includes:
 - CoC Consolidated Application (“Exhibit 1”)
 - CoC Priority Listing
 - Project Applications (new and renewal)

→ Application Timeline

- 8/1 HUD release of Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)
- 8/5 OR-506CoC release of Request for Proposals (RFP)
- 8/10 Q&A session for potential new project applicants
- 8/31 Application deadline for new and renewal project applications
- 9/7 New project presentations and scoring by HSSN
- 9/14 CoC Board completes rating and ranking of project applications
- 9/23 Application posted online for public review and comment
- 9/28 Application submitted to HUD (HUD submission deadline: 9/30)

Available Bonus Funding for New Projects


CoC Bonus (up to \$196,663)

- Eligible project types:
 - Permanent Supportive Housing (PH-PSH)
 - Rapid Re-Housing (PH-RRH)
 - Joint Transitional Housing/Rapid Re-Housing (TH/PH-RRH)
 - Supportive Services Only - Coordinated Entry (SSO-CE) project to support coordinated entry system operations

DV Bonus (up to \$195,058)

- Eligible population served: survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking that are defined as homeless
- Eligible project types:
 - Rapid Re-Housing (PH-RRH)
 - Joint Transitional Housing/Rapid Re-Housing (TH/PH-RRH)
 - SSO-CE project to implement policies, procedures, and practices that equip the CoC's coordinated entry to better meet the needs of survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking

- Exercise to identify potential priorities for new project applications to address system gaps
- Great ideas – not enough time

Project Application Rating and Ranking Process

- Project applications are rated based on evaluation criteria developed by the CoC Board and defined in the *CoC Board Application and Award Policy*
- HSSN voting members rate new project applications
- Staff complete rating worksheets for renewal projects based on review of performance data and objective criteria
- CoC Board reviews the rating summaries
- CoC Board makes project ranking and selection decisions

- Essential and time-sensitive step in the CoC application process
- CoC Board will discuss and then vote on:
 - Ranking and selection of new and renewal project applications
