

Draft Goals for One Governance

Meaningful engagement of our community and stakeholders to guide priorities, policy and program improvements

Accessible participation that build upon current success, expands involvement, and provides clarity in decision making processes.

Unified governance consistent with Washington County, HUD, and Metro requirements for oversight and advisement

Draft Process for One Governance

Phase 1: Inquire	 Convene project steering committee Stakeholder discussions Community survey Research best practices
Phase 2: One Plan	 Identify new system challenges, needs, goals Combine plans: Local Implementation Plan and A Road Home Review with bodies, finalize and approve with Board
Phase 3: Proposal	 Draft proposed governance structure Feedback with current bodies bodies Review for accountability requirements Convene community and stakeholder feedback
Phase 4: Finalize & Approve	 Governance proposal finalized with current bodies Board of County Commissioners reviews, approves Membership recruitment and appointments Body convenes

Next steps: One Governance

Convene Steering Committee

Membership:

- 2-3 hours per month | irregular meetings | 1 year commitment
- Seeking 4-5 members from each current governance body (12-15 total) Role:
 - Review materials
 - Provide feedback
 - Act as ambassadors for the project

Phase 1: To Do's

- Advise on early outreach plan
- Review community survey and discussion questions
- Represent project process to committee committees
