Agenda Title: DECLARE AN EMERGENCY RELATED TO COVID-19

SUMMARY:

Washington County Health and Human Services, the County Administrative Office and County Counsel are bringing forward a request for consideration of a second declaration of emergency related to COVID-19. We are simply requesting an extension of the order adopted on March 4th, 2020. No expansion of authority is requested.

Two individuals in Washington County have presumptively tested positive for the novel coronavirus, COVID-19. Our Public Health Division is working on many fronts to support activities that keep our community safe. Approving a declaration of emergency will allow for additional resources to assist in the response to COVID-19. The declaration will also provide the Board with more tools to use to address COVID-19.

A declaration of emergency is authorized under Chapter 8.36 of the Washington County Code. A declaration lasts 14 days.

Before requesting that the Board take action on the declaration, Public Health staff will provide a COVID-19 update.

5	This matter having come before the Washington County Board on March 17, 2020, and
6	It appearing to the Board that:
7	WHEREAS, ORS 401.305 provides authority for Washington County to act as an emergency
8	management agency, including authority to establish policies and protocols for defining and
9	directing responsibilities during time of emergency; and
10	WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020 the Board of Commissioners adopted a Resolution and Order
11	declaring a state of emergency and the conditions that created that state of emergency continue
12	to exist; and
13	WHEREAS, Washington County has enacted a local ordinance (County Code Chapter
14	8.36) pursuant to the authority granted by ORS Chapter 401 and the Washington County
15	Charter, that provides for executive responsibility in times of emergency and specifically
16	delegates authority to declare a state of emergency to the Board of Commissioners, or if a
17	quorum of the Board of Commissioners is unavailable, to the County Chair, Vice Chair,
18	Commissioners, County Administrator, Assistant Administrator, Sheriff (if preceding official is
19	unavailable); and
20	WHEREAS, the following conditions have resulted in the need for an extension of the
21	declaration of the state of emergency:

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Т	The first two cases of Coronavirus (COVID-19) have been detected in Washington
2	County; and
3	WHEREAS, the following disruption of important services, damage to life, or damage to
4	property can be expected from the above conditions:
5	COVID-19 is expanding world-wide and now has occurred in Washington
6	County. County resources will be needed to respond to this threat to keep the public as
7	safe as possible. Resources related to contact tracing, disease investigation and
8	prevention, continuity of operations, public information, and funding are expected to be
9	exhausted; and
10	WHEREAS, the foregoing continues to affect the entire County and;
11	now, therefore, it is
12	RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Board of Commissioners for Washington County
13	formally extends the declaration of a state of emergency for Washington County that the Board
14	adopted and was in effect on March 4, 2020; and it is further
15	RESOLVED AND ORDERED that, upon declaration of a state of emergency the Board of
16	Commissioners shall be authorized to take such actions and issue such orders as are determined
17	to be necessary to protect the public and property and to efficiently conduct activities that
18	minimize or mitigate the effect of the emergency as described in WCC 8.36.050., and further that
19	the County Office of Emergency Management is empowered to carry out the appropriate
20	function and duties identified in County Code Chapter 8.36 during times of emergency and shall

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implement the Washington County Emergency Operations Plan; and it is further

1	RESOLVED AND ORDERED that the Emergency Program Manager shall take all necessary
2	steps authorized by law to coordinate response and recovery from this emergency including, but
3	not limited to, requesting assistance and potential reimbursements from the State of Oregon and
4	the appropriate federal agencies; and it is further
5	RESOLVED AND ORDERED that emergency procurements of goods and services are
6	authorized pursuant to ORS 279B.080, ORS 279C.335(6), ORS 279.380(4), and Rules of
7	Procurement, Section 20-020; and it is further
8	RESOLVED AND ORDERED that this declaration of emergency shall expire on April 2, 2020.
