Project Updates: Funding

Measure 110 Grant:

- In December, Washington County submitted an application for M110 funding
 - CATT Capital Development gap funding
 - Behavioral Health Resource Network coordinator
- Total Request: \$17M

Project Update: Funding



Measure 110 (cont):

- Grant approved on April 26th!
- Amount is not determined
- Next steps:
 - Meet with OHA staff to begin negotiations
 - Amount awarded may be influenced by County-based Allotment



Project Update: Funding

Opioid Settlement:

- \$12.7M over 18 years
- May increase as additional settlements are approved
- Goal is to use these dollars to support and stabilize operational costs
- Separate fund

Project Update: Funding

Opioid Settlement:

- Outreach to cities
- Prioritize supporting unfunded/underfunded services such as sobering and stabilization



Project Update: Provider Selection

- The RFP for intensive services was published on April 1st
- Several organizations have downloaded the RFP
- Due May 27th
- Award in June




Project Update: Architect Selection


