Meeting Summary

1. Welcome & Introductions	
2. Project Updates: a. Architectural design	 ISB: Kristin presented exterior design concepts for the Intensive Services Building. There had been two options on the table: adding a second story to the existing building or creating an addition next to the building. Due to cost, we will go with the second option. CSB: both exterior and interior design concepts were shared. The Community Services Building is built around a central hub in the middle of the building. Feedback was good- group really liked the design and feel of the space. Question: Will transportation be provided for south County residents? Answer: the CATT is part of a much bigger system expansion that is occurring right now. Measure 110 has resulted in Behavioral Health Resource Networks being created. In Washington County these networks will include several outreach programs. Our goal is to connect with these programs and see if they can assist in helping people from other parts of the county access the CATT when it is open.
b. Outpatient services	 Solutions Group NW has been selected to provide the outpatient services at the CATT CSB building. Sanjay Raizada, from Solutions Group, shared some information about their organization, highlighting their focus on serving our Latinx communities. They offer culturally





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	specific services in Spanish with native-speaking staff.
c. Funding	 Nick provided an overview of the CATT financials at this time. Recent assessments of the capital costs to renovate the two buildings came back much higher than earlier estimates. This left us with a significant deficit that we hadn't anticipated. At the same time, we recently learned that we would be receiving additional opioid settlement funding which would partially fill the deficit. Staff discussed the strategies they will use to fill the gap. There was a discussion on how making things smaller will help to reduce cost. This would also help with ongoing operational costs. Kristin shared the process that was used to design the buildings. Some things were included that are not absolutely necessary and we are now working on reducing the scale to reduce the overall cost without compromising the clinical services to be provided. Fundraising opportunities? — looking at legislative sessions, opioid funds, federal earmark, M110 funding
d. Community engagement planning	 Staff will be meeting with the Five Oaks Triple Creek Neighborhood Advisory Committee on 3/14/23. Staff are also in the beginning stages of planning an open house at the Evergreen site. This will be focused on engaging nearby neighbors and helping them understand our plans for the CATT.
3. CATT health services discussion	 One of the key services that was identified by the Program Development Work Group was health services. The goal was to integrate some health services at the CSB, however these were not well defined. Staff have been meeting with representatives of several organizations including Central City Concern, Virginia Garcia, OHSU, CODA, and LifeWorks NW. They also toured the Ed Blackburn building and LifeWorks NW's Rockwood site, both of which have integrated health services including primary care and a pharmacy.





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	 Additional considerations are how to support our houseless community members, should CATT health services also coordinate with shelters? At this time, we are planning on having an onsite pharmacy. The other health services haven't been defined yet. Several models have been proposed including holding wound care clinics using nursing students, care coordination models to connect into existing care systems and immediate care services. Feedback from SC: Using nursing students is a great idea Can we use CCBHC funding for Virginia Garcia and LifeWorks NW?
