# Land Acknowledgment

### **Washington County Land Acknowledgment**

(as prepared by representatives of Confederate Tribes of Grand Ronde, Nez Perce, Siletz, and Yavapai)

We want to acknowledge the people on whose land we live—the Atfalati-Kalapuyans also known as the Tualatin Band of Kalapuyans—the first inhabitants of Washington County. We are grateful for the land we are on, Kalapuyan land.

Signers of the Willamette Valley Treaty of 1855 were removed from their homelands to the Grand Ronde Indian Reservation. Today their descendants are tribal members of Grand Ronde and Siletz tribes, carrying on the traditions and cultures of their ancestors.

We acknowledge and express gratitude for the ancestors of this place and recognize that we are here because of the sacrifices forced upon them. In remembering these communities, we honor their legacy, their lives, and their continuation in our community. Please reflect on the role government has played in the painful, colonial history and reflect as well on the resilience and healing of the Indigenous land and communities.

We would like to invite everyone to collaborate and work together with the tribes to take care of the land and water and the people who inhabit these spaces.

Helping older adults, veterans and people with physical disabilities access information and resources that help maintain independence and enhance quality of life.



# Who We Serve

- People who live in Washington County
- People over 60 and their caregivers
- People over 55 and caring for a spouse or partner with dementia
- People over 18 with a physical disability
- Veterans and their families

### Special focus on:

- People living at or below 185% poverty level
- LGBTQ+ veterans and LGBTQ+ older adults
- □ Black, Indigenous and People of Color
- People aging with HIV+
- People experiencing language barriers

### Population Level Data

### Approximately 590,000 residents total

- 19% are over the age of 60
- 9% are 85 or over
- Older adult population is growing and is overall less diverse than general population

### 10% overall experience a disability


- Disability prevalence increases with age
- Greater proportion of American Indian and Alaska
   Natives experience a disability (14.7%)

#### 7% overall are veterans

- 45% of veterans are older adults
- 33% served in Vietnam Era

# Oregon Project Independence

In-home supports for individuals who need some assistance to remain safely in their own homes.

- Provides 15-20 hours per month of professional caregiving assistance such as:
  - Bathing
  - Dressing
  - Laundry/housekeeping
  - Using the bathroom
  - Transportation
  - Meal preparation
  - Other needs



# Family Caregiver Support Program

Assists unpaid caregivers who support family and chosen family members at home, oversee care in a facility, or manage care long distance. Also serves adults 55+ who are caring for children.


