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Under the Housing Rehabilitation category, per a February 2018 decision by the PAB, staff was authorized to use prior NSP program income to support an additional staff person to assist in carrying out additional funding from the City of Hillsboro. This has been very successful over the last three years. The City of Hillsboro intends to continue that allocation in FY 21/22.

You will also note \$20,000 has been allocated to the construction projects to cover the OCD staff costs of Davis-Bacon compliance.
