4. <u>LETTERS TO CITIES RE: NATIONAL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT WEEK</u>

The Office of Community Development will be asking for municipalities to adopt a proclamation celebrating Community Development and all the projects funded through the CDBG and HOME programs. CD Week is April 18-22nd this year. Cities are encouraged to also proclaim Fair Housing Month for the month of April.
