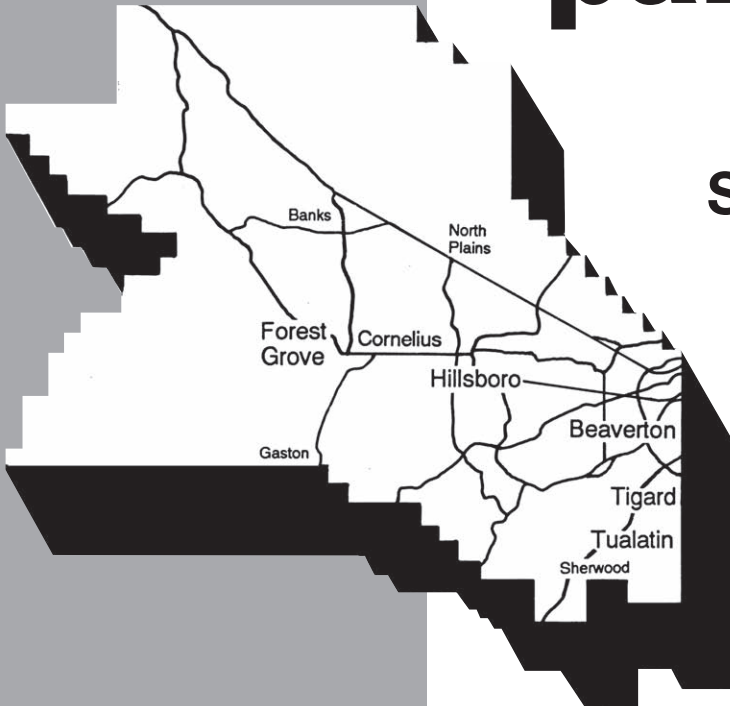

The following are my priorities:

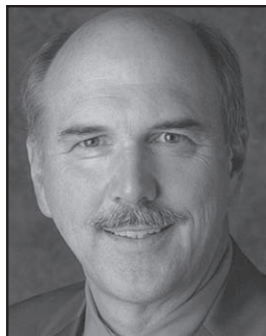

1. The board has stated that going to the Willamette River to supply our drinking water is not "on the table".
2. An unknown portion of budget expenditures have been made to research the feasibility of using the Willamette as our primary water supply instead of the pristine water of Bull Run.
3. Invested \$18 million in Wilsonville's Water Treatment Plant.
4. Since 1973 has had one of the rare "water rights permits" to use the Willamette. The permit has been extended to 2047.
5. Has become a dues paying member of the "WRWC", a coalition of neighboring water districts (except Portland) who share common interest in the development (translation: clean up toxins) of the Willamette River.
6. Has "transferred" TVWD's water rights permit to WRWC. (It's illegal to sell them.)
7. Has not provided open access to the growing number of citizen action groups concerned about safe water and the lack of transparency, fiscal accountability, conservation alternatives and public input when these major decisions are made by the board.

If elected to the board I will correct these problems and introduce a policy of openness, transparency and accountability to the TVWD board.

Looking to the future, I understand management has a very clear strategy in place to expand our water supply to take care of increased demand. This would include developing sufficient assets and growing the financial strength to support that effort. Of course, I would be concerned that water rates are kept low while endeavoring to generate the necessary revenue to support these plans.
