The expiring levy provides 45% of total WCCLS funding.		
Replacement levy would help maintain and provide:		
 Reading and learning support for kids and teens, including homework help for students. Central services that efficiently link libraries together so users can browse collections and reserve materials for pickup at their nearest library. 		
 Open hours and access to books and materials for everyone in the community. Children's reading events including story times for babies, toddlers and preschoolers. 		
The replacement levy would set a fixed rate of 37¢ per \$1,000 of assessed value, an increase of 15¢. In 2026, typical homeowners with an assessed value (not market value) of \$348,600 would pay about \$129 annually, or \$4.55 more per month than the current levy expiring in June 2026. The library levy rate was last replaced by voters in 2015.
