
Comic Books (available in English and Spanish):

These comic books help explain preparedness and response activities from a teens standpoint to various natural disasters that maybe occurring in Oregon.








CDC – Preparedness 101: Zombie Pandemic Plan Comic

Bookmark with minimal information, but contains a link and QR code to sign up for alerts about natural disasters and other emergencies that impact Washington County






2 Weeks Ready – My Pocket Plan (available in English and Spanish)

Living on Shaky ground (available in English and Spanish)



Community Presentation

- 1 hour presentation for community members
- Training focuses on general/broad preparedness: know the hazards, make a plan, build a kit
- Topic specific training can be recommended as well (ie: preparedness for older adults, preparedness for school aged kits, etc)
- Presentation not guaranteed with request depends on staff availability

Staff Training

- 2 hour presentation to staff which providers a deeper understanding of preparedness topics and where to find information/resources
- Goal of presentation is to increase staff knowledge/awareness so if they are asked a preparedness question by a client they can provide an answer
- Training covers:
 - Food and water preparedness, emergency supplies and personalizing supplies, disaster sanitation, basic emergency plan, signing up for emergency alerts, pet preparedness, and websites for resources and information
- Presentation not guaranteed with request depends on staff availability
