

WARNING: DO NOT EAT!

Food items have been recalled due to lead contamination

WanaBana, Weis and Schnucks have recalled their apple cinnamon fruit puree pouches regardless of expiration date and lot code as part of an ongoing Federal Drug Administration (FDA) investigation into lead-contaminated food products. The products have a long shelf life and should be thrown out.



Health effects of lead exposure:

Even low levels of lead in blood have been shown to negatively affect a child's intelligence, ability to pay attention, and academic achievement.

What you should do:



Do not eat any recalled food puree pouches.

Throw away or return any recalled apple cinnamon fruit puree pouches.



Call your health care provider.

Schedule a blood test for lead if you or your children may have consumed recalled products.
