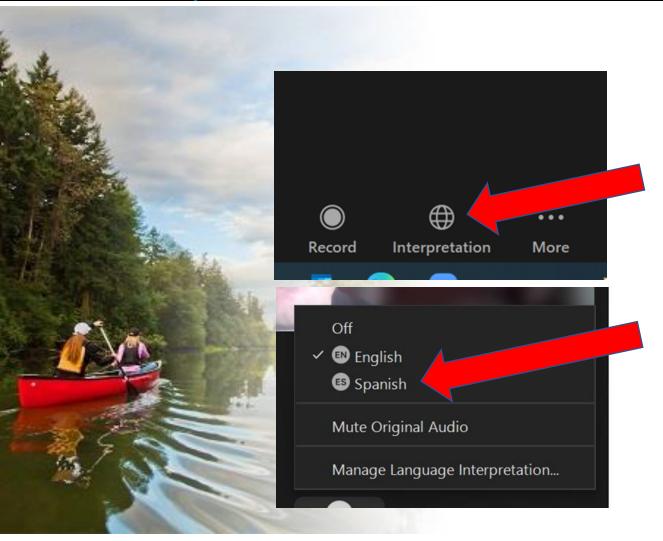

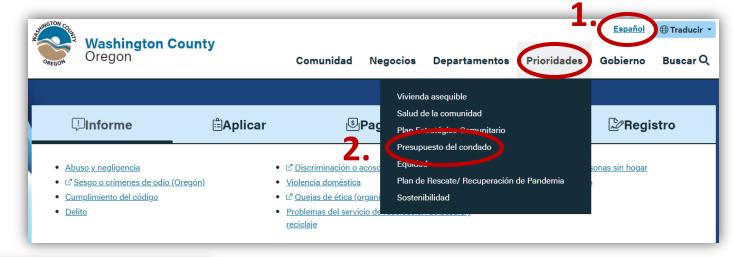

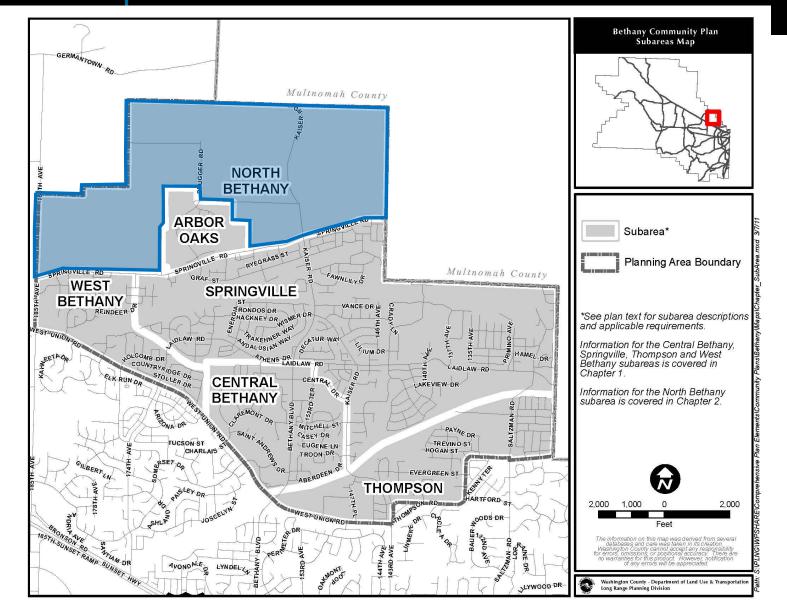

Continues work on Kaiser Road complete street improvement (Springville to Brugger Road):

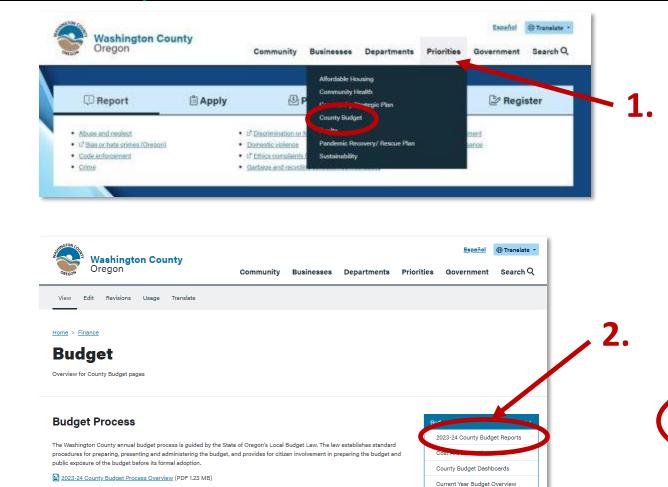
\$5.5 million previously allocated for design and construction; no change

### ENHANCED SHERIFF'S PATROL DISTRICT (ESPD)

- Formed by Board of Commissioners and approved by voters in 1987
- In 1987 the Washington County's Public Safety Review Committee recognized one officer per 1,000 as a minimum service standard
- Law enforcement services for residents in the urban unincorporated areas
- Continuous voter approval for over 35 years
- Approved by voters in May 2022, services will continue services through 2028



The ESPD provides law enforcement services for about 218,500 residents in the urban areas outside of cities in Washington County, including:

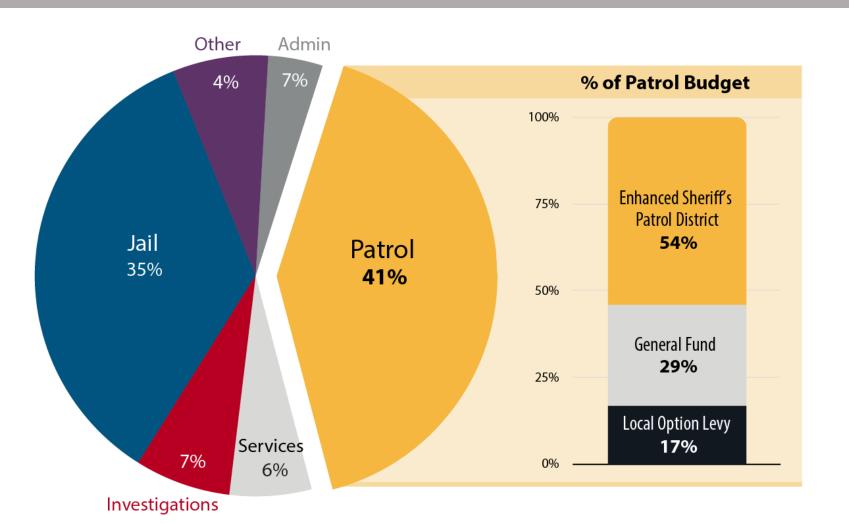




## **ESPD** Funding Provides

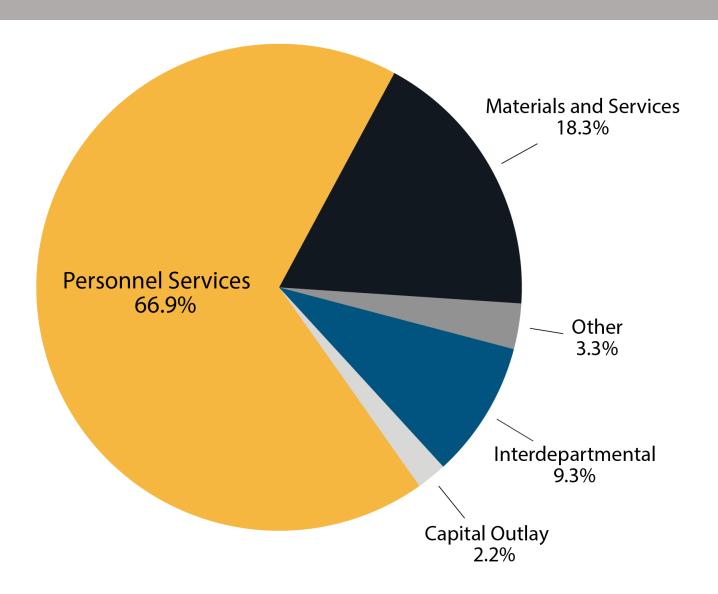

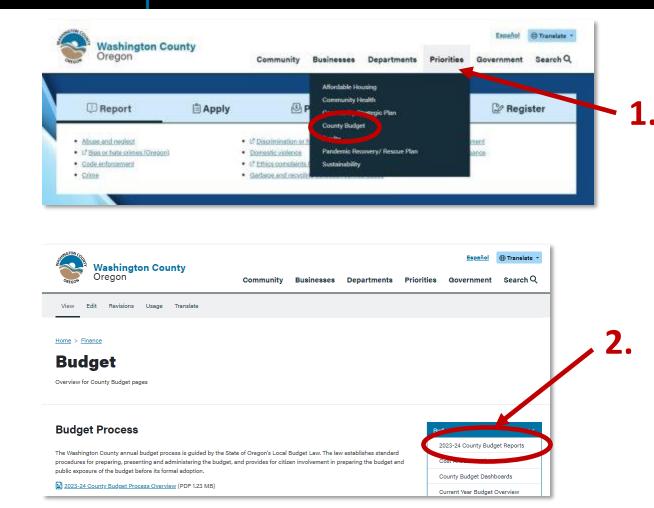

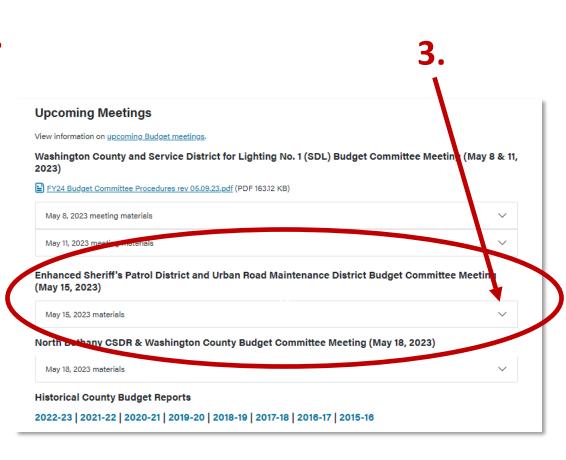
