- Measure 110 ramifications



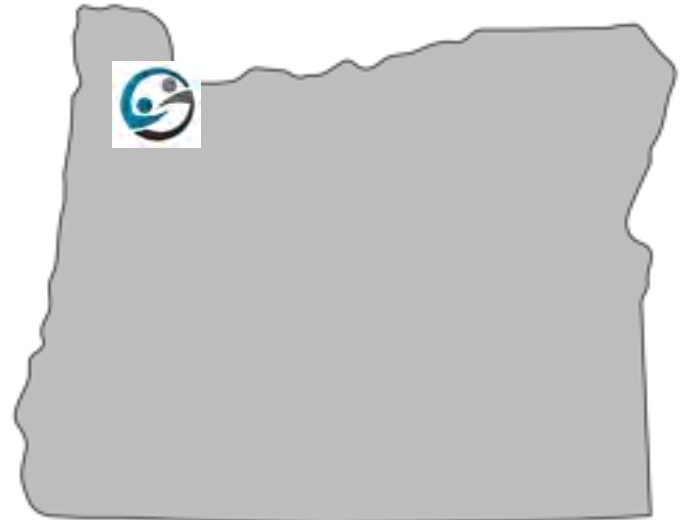
Workforce

- Set realistic expectations in feasibility study



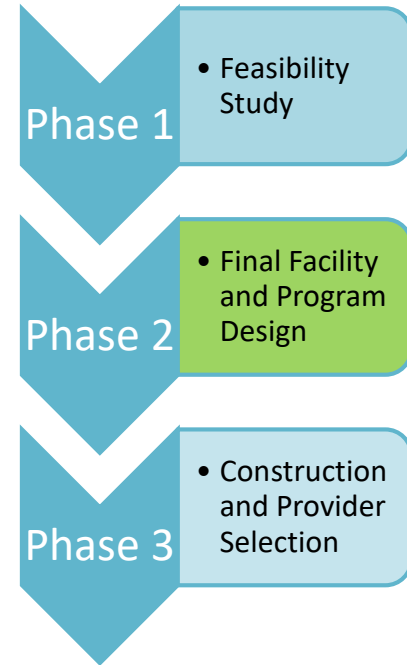
Facility Size

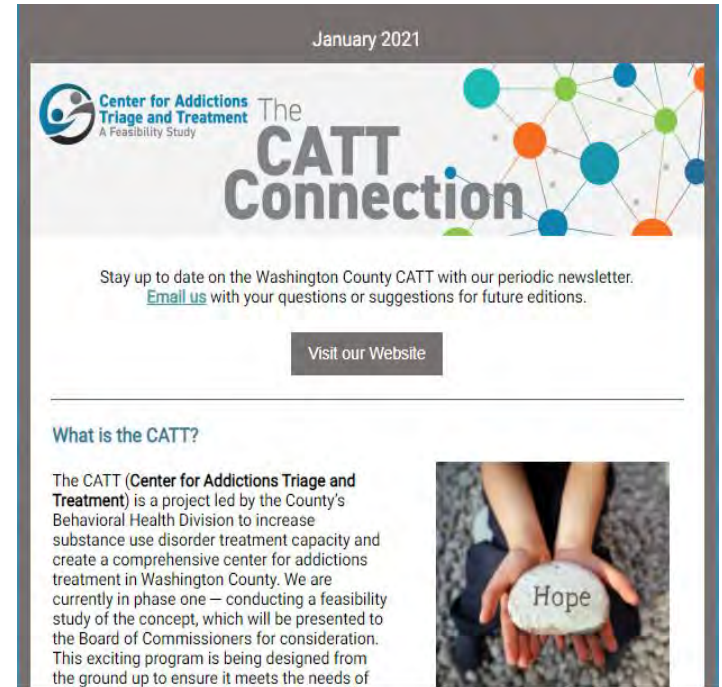

- Based on the considerations reviewed, what revisions need to be made to the decision?

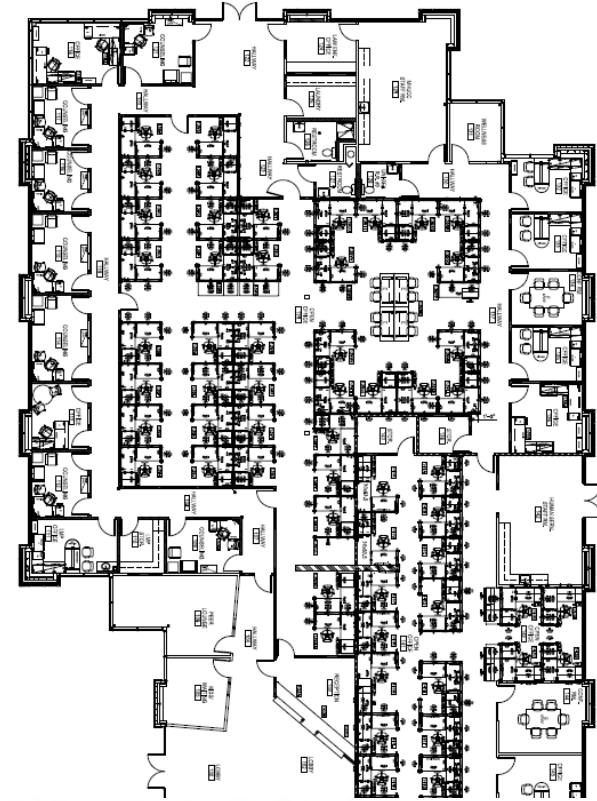

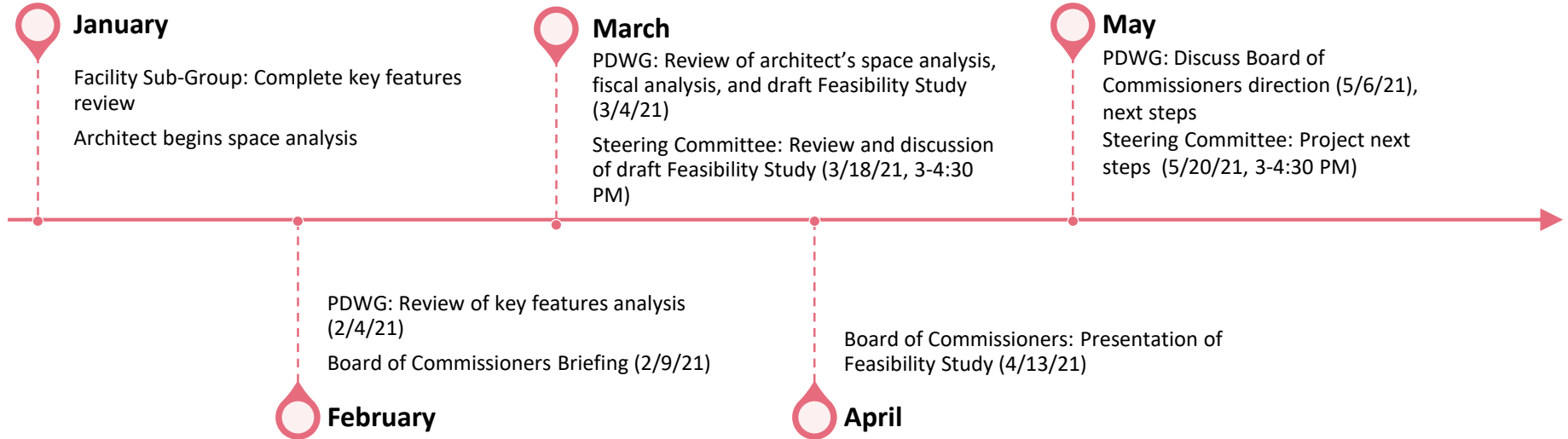


Supportive Housing
