  - Determine return on revenue (ROR)
  - Staff recommends adjustments
  - Solid Waste Advisory Committee reviews and makes recommendation
  - Board takes action
  - New rates become effective July 1

# 2020 rate review findings

2020 Rate Review Results	
Revenue	\$31,944,022
Income (Profit)	\$ 3,132,935
Return on Revenue (ROR)	9.81%

2020 ROR by Line of Service		
Residential	10.04%	
Commercial	8.91%	
Drop Box	9.95%	
Total System	9.81%





