⁽¹⁾ HUD definition of Chronic Homeless - Federal definition defines a chronically homeless person as "either 1) an unaccompanied homeless individual with a disabling condition who has been continuously homeless for a year or more, OR 2) an unaccompanied individual with a disabling condition who has had a least four episodes of homelessness in the past three years."

2007 count includes homeless persons who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. Include those who:

- are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason;
- are living in emergency or transitional shelters or awaiting foster care placement;
- have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings;
- are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings;
- are persons temporarily in an institution (e.g.- hospital or jail) and came from or will return to one of the above situations.
