Draft HSSN COC Board Recruitment Plan

Goal: Our goal is to have the HSSN COC Board demographics be representative of the demographics (race, ethnicity, LGBTQI and other) in our County.

Steps towards this goal:

- 1. Establish County demographic makeup that we are working to represent.
- 2. Identify demographics on the current HSSN COC Board.
- 3. When a new position opens or when someone's term ends, identify potential new members who would increase equitable representation.
- 4. Actively promote these open positions among groups that would reach target populations:
 - a) HSSN Network (Let network know that Board members do not need to be top officials).
 - b) Local city leadership programs that train BIPOC community members.
- 5. Add culturally specific organization position to HSSN COC Board. This is consistent with recent Housing Supportive Services RFP focus and priority.
- 6. Create a stipend for board participation to help low income community members be able to participate on the board.
