DV Bonus (up to $\$ 195,058$ )

- Eligible population served: survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking that are defined as homeless
- Eligible project types:
- Rapid Re-Housing (PH-RRH)
- Joint Transitional Housing/Rapid Re-Housing (TH/PH-RRH)
- SSO-CE project to implement policies, procedures, and practices that equip the CoC's coordinated entry to better meet the needs of survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking

## $\rightarrow$ Project Application Rating and Ranking Process

- Project applications are rated based on evaluation criteria developed by the CoC Board and defined in the CoC Board Application and Award Policy
- HSSN voting members rate new project applications
- Staff complete rating worksheets for renewal projects based on review of performance data and objective criteria
- CoC Board reviews the rating summaries
- CoC Board makes project ranking and selection decisions
