

And, Annual Wages for Low-Income Industries Grew Slightly Faster than Total Nonfarm Employment Between 2015 and 2020


Average Annual Wages for Low-Income Industries by Year





But, Fair Market Rents for 1-Bedrooms Increased 30%

Washington County Experienced a Higher Occupancy Rate Than the City of Portland in 2020





Share of Jobs Created by Industry Type, Projections 2019-2029











Washington County Continues to See a Declining Unemployment Rate in August 2021








Employment in Washington County Remained Essentially Unchanged in August 2021



Nearly Every Industry Continues to Show Signs of Employment Recovery Compared With August 2021








Consumer Spending Remains Strong as We Enter the Holiday Season

Percent Change in All Consumer Spending*




