Washington County Emergency Sheltering Framework

About the Project

Washington County has contracted with Hagerty Consulting, on behalf of the Washington County Emergency Management Cooperative (EMC), to develop a comprehensive sheltering framework to address general population emergency sheltering needs in a major disaster. Through the development of this Framework, stakeholders will establish a planning partnership, identify sheltering strategies, and make key decisions about how shelters will be managed.

What is Emergency Sheltering?

Sheltering is the term that describes the shelter facilities and all related functions to provide disaster survivors with a safe, accessible place to sleep, eat, get information, maintain personal hygiene, and access additional services to assist them on the path towards disaster recovery.

Additional Sheltering Planning Considerations:

An all-hazards, Whole Community planning approach will ensure that shelter services meet the disaster-caused needs of the community. The planning stakeholder group should include representatives from any entity that will have a role in shelter operations, including government entities; the private sector; and non-profit, faith-based, and community-based organizations. Shelter planning should also consider disability services, logistics, planning, finance and administration, and volunteer and donations management.

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About Sheltering

The number of shelters open after a disaster can range from a couple to dozens. These shelters can stay open a few days or weeks, depending on factors like the scale of the disaster


Management

Designated sheltering stakeholders will work in existing emergency operations centers to manage operations, coordinate strategy and policies, and maintain information and situational awareness.

Operations

A shelter manager and assistant oversee the on-site activities of individual shelters, including workers that manage the registration, dormitory, feeding, physical health and mental health, and ancillary services like childcare or recovery casework.
