A recent survey from Kaiser Permanente found that nearly 70% of Americans reported at least one unmet social need in the past year. The survey also found that 97% of Americans want their providers to ask about social needs during medical visits. Addressing these social needs is an integral part of quality care and the key challenge that Thrive Local aims to solve.

What is Thrive Local?

Thrive Local is a community partner network that connects health and social service providers to deliver integrated whole person care. Thrive Local is a partnership between Kaiser Permanente and Unite Us. The network uses a shared technology platform (Unite Us), to send and receive trackable referrals between providers and community-based organizations — connecting individuals to an array of services such as housing, employment, food assistance, behavioral health, utilities, and more. The HIPAA-compliant platform allows users to track the status and progress of their clients' referrals and the outcomes of the services provided.
