Transition Advisory Group (TAG)




- Convened in January, 2023 to help guide the transition to one advisory body in Washington County
- TAG members include HSSN members, CoC Board members and HPAC members
- Have met at least 3 times since inception
- Have provided One Governance updates to HSSN, CoC Board,
 HPAC throughout the process to solicit additional input.

Bylaw Review and Approval Process



- High level draft review with HSSN (today)
- Feedback by HPAC, HSSN and CoC Board (Aug/Sept/Oct)
- CoC Board votes to recommend to Board of County
 Commissioners (Oct)
- Board of County Commissioners vote to adopt (Dec)

- 9 15 members | 3-year terms up to two terms
- Diversity of representation (geographic, income, cultural, racial, and personal experience)
 - Geographic representation shall include reasonable distribution of representation from each of the four districts of Washington County.
 - Must include at least two people with lived experience of homelessness
- Diversity of expertise (homeless services, workforce development, criminal justice, behavioral health, healthcare, education, civil rights, advocates)
 - Cannot have a majority of service provider representation



Recruitment Process



- Use Washington County "Boards and Commissions" recommended procedures
- HAB recommends slate of candidates to the Board of County Commissioners for appointment
- Initial slate to be reviewed and recommended by TAG members and additional County staff to ensure no conflict of interest.
- Going forward applications to be reviewed by a temporary workgroup, recommended to the HAB for appointment

Committees/Workgroups/Convenings



- 1. <u>Standing Committees</u>: Required committees, established meeting schedule, members appointed by HAB, members may include technical experts and HAB members.
- 2. <u>Temporary workgroups</u>: Optional and time limited, as requested by HAB, membership informally assembled to meet the needs of the project.
- 3. <u>Community membership and convenings</u>: Required broader engagement to inform policy decision of the HAB, open to the public, convened no less than twice annually.

- a) Lived Experience Advisory Committee
- b) Performance Evaluation technical sub-committee (rating and ranking process)
- c) Equitable Procurement technical sub-committee (NOFO recommendation)
- d) Coordinated Entry technical sub-committee
- e) HMIS technical sub-committee

Temporary Workgroups



- ☐ Examples might include:
 - Shelter siting workgroup
 - Membership recruitment, review and nomination workgroup
- Temporary workgroups will convene for no more than one (1) year. After a year, if the work is needed to continue, they can ask the HAB to continue on assignment or recommend that the workgroup become a standing committee.
