






# Council Creek Regional Trail (CCRT)

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








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


### Master Plan completed



## Draft Vision Statement

The vision of the Council Creek Regional Trail project is to create an active mobility corridor that feels safe, serves and welcomes a broad population, and is integrated with other planned projects. The CCRT will be a six-mile long, ecologically sustainable, off-street multiuse pathway that connects the downtown cores of Forest Grove, Cornelius, and Hillsboro. It will be designed for people of all ages and abilities to walk, bike, and roll for recreation and transportation.
