## **NOTARIZING PLATS**

## **Notarizing plats (For Oregon Notaries: ORS 194.280):**

(8) The imprint of the official **stamp of a notary public is not required** to effectuate a notarization of a subdivision or partition plat required under ORS 92.010 to 92.192 or a condominium plat required under ORS 100.115, or any replat, supplement or amendment thereto, if the following appear below the notary public's signature:

As a result of non-permanent inks and stamp pads, we prefer that notaries do not stamp plats. Documents that may smudge, smear, or bleed onto other documents may be rejected.

All signatures must be in archival black ink. Signatures with ball point pens, colored ink, etc. are not acceptable.

Pursuant to item #10 of the TRI\_COUNTY DRAFTING STANDARDS FOR SURVEYS AND PLATS for Clackamas, Multnomah, and Washington Counties, "...Mylars contaminated by adhesives or any other materials will be rejected.... No rubber ink stamps are allowed on mylar survey or plat maps. Notary crimp stamps are not allowed."
