## **Welcome & Intro**

### **Washington County Land Use & Transportation - Dyami Valentine updating**

- Washington County Transit Study
- Countywide transit study – enhance transit system to help more people get to places & meet needs of riders. Develop a shared vision & create a roadmap to get it done.
  - o Goals of equity, environmental health, economic vitality, customer experience & partnerships
  - o 18 month effort from kickoff, goals/needs, drafting recommendations, public input to final vision
  - o Identified what works well (affordability, convenience, avoiding traffic) and barriers (feeling unsafe, long travel times, lack of sidewalks/safe crossings, infrequent service, lack of info)
  - o Identified capital investment priorities & frequent/shuttle service vision
- Microtransit pilot – service an area with on-demand rideshare service that provides point-to-point service within a transit-deficient area. Kickoff in next few months with goal of service implementation in 2025
- Farmington Road Concept Plan – design concept for section of SW Farmington under State of Oregon jurisdiction between SW 198<sup>th</sup> & SW Kinnaman Rd. Role for CPO6 on Advisory Committee
- Question from Fran – noted rideshare goes over 175<sup>th</sup>, concerns about that road in the winter, wants to connect offline
- Ken – curious about plans for 185<sup>th</sup>, not signed as a hazardous road
- Eric – question that TriMet had a market share of about 10% in the 1980s, currently at about 3%, concern that in late 90s in south Cooper Mtn by the kink, annexed into TriMet tax district but do not get the services. Does TriMet have retrospect to figure out why taxes are the same but trip counts have gone down (admitted rhetorical question) Response – potentially different provider providing flexible service & evaluate the demand for transit
- Laurie Coffman – question regarding 209<sup>th</sup> construction, no bus service anywhere near there with incoming houses & businesses, closest service on 198<sup>th</sup>. Response – potential service on Blanton to connect through South Hillsboro
- Ken - is the final transportation plan available online for public viewing? Yes, link will be provided

## **Public Safety Update**

**Water District Update** – Justin Dyke updating

- 209<sup>th</sup> & Farmington, wrapping up parts of that project
- From TV Hwy & Corn Pass down to Farmington, moving water & filtering until we get water that's ready to enter water system – has to go through flushing & passing water quality tests
- Sometime in spring – will do a grand opening & tour, invite affected neighborhoods to see what was done, how it works
- 189<sup>th</sup> & Hart – maintain reservoir & well, in beginning stages of tearing that down, waiting for final grading permits to demolish & build new pump station in its footprint up to Cooper Mtn (expected year and half construction)

**Sheriff's Office** – Meghan Rasmussen updating

- Career open house coming up April 13<sup>th</sup> for anyone interested in law enforcement careers
- K9 trials upcoming, allows public to learn about K9 units and training (May 18<sup>th</sup> at Hillsboro Stadium), includes K9 competition and safety fair
- Recruiting for Search & Rescue (14-17 year olds) and Reserve Deputies
- Shared calls for service map (unfortunately deputy representative was called away so unable to answer any specific questions)

**Tualatin Hills Park & Rec Update** - Tim Bonnin updating

- Spring break planning – open swim times will be available end of March, also Spring break camps available
- Summer Registration opens Saturday April 13<sup>th</sup> for in-district residents, and April 15<sup>th</sup> for out-of-district residents
- Needs volunteers, especially youth who want to be part of RISE Youth program for kids 13+ to help with district events, classes, & camps. Also interested in kids 12+ who want to be junior lifeguards. Also call for coaches (adult volunteers) – volleyball, track & field
- South Cooper Mtn – naming survey out for new parks
- Safety improvements coming to Waterhouse trail – construct pedestrian crossings with curb ramps, expected to start mid-late 2024

### **Cooper Mountain Transportation** – Fran Warren presenting

- Transportation for high growth communities (presentation from Fran as an individual, not as part of Treekeepers of WashCo)
- UGB expanding westward of 175<sup>th</sup> & Scholls Ferry but no new arterials
- How do we handle new residents while not creating climate change problems
- Recent history – Ordinance 882 to continue study for Cooper Mtn area – how do we break transportation studies deadlock of 35 years. Westside Bypass, LUTRAQ, WashCo Transportation Futures Study and now 882
- Presented map of concentration of jobs compared to where homes are going in. Predicament – how do we get people from the bedroom communities to where the jobs are
- Financially constrained projects – no throughways or transit projects planned in area through 2040
- Problem as stated in 2014 – high concentration of homes but no new roads – tie in to Dyami’s presentation
- How to do this without damaging natural resources and waterways
- Transit should go on Tile Flat Rd
- Shared State of Oregon map of Priority Wildlife Connectivity areas
- Shared parks overlay – (what Tim had mentioned for Cooper Mtn) – planned parks in S Cooper Mtn area
