Notes: Dick Smith gave a talk about the history of the Scholls, Farmington, and Jacktown area. He discussed the old Tile Mill along the Tualatin River right before the bridge on Scholls and the office can still be seen. The local schools such as Jacktown and Kinton before being consolidated into Groner, What life was like pre/WWII and the old watch tower where the Twin Oaks tavern used to be. He also mentioned the Methodist church at the corner of River Rd and Farmington but the pastor and wife were killed by an electric train in Hillsboro when they went to pick up the hymn books and the church was never used. Dick talked about the various women's clubs like Jacktown and Scholl's women's club. He brought a series of old pictures for people to look at. Dick also discussed everyday life, what crops were grown, how many of the roads were unpaved, the sense of community, but also the hardships such as the numerous fires in the old houses and barns. Many people shared a story of their own or added their knowledge to what Dick had to say and many residents who had a long heritage and history attended as well.
