



Climbing, scavengar hunts, and tactile play















## **Preferred Concept Plan**

### How do we name parks?



- Park names that to match the diversity of the community
- Intentionally inclusive outreach with cultural partners
- Engagement through in-depth discussions, historic and photographic archives
- Honor and reflect the diverse experiences, identities, and ecologies across the district



#### **Park Name**

#### Saqasqa Park (sahk/a/sahk/a)

- Arabic onomatopoeia for a bird's tweet-tweet sound
- Brings life to the community's vision of a place to observe birds and other wildlife
- Prompts visitors to listen for the frequent singing of birds in the nearby wetlands
- Signs in the park can help explain the meaning of the name











### **Waterhouse Trail**

- Merlo Station to PCC Rock Creek
- Connects to 3 regional and 3 community trails
- Includes play equipment, multi-use field, basketball courts, and community gardens
- Challenges: Pedestrian barriers

### **Westside Trail**

- Feasibility studies help raise funds
- Pedestrian bridge crossing over Hwy 26:
  - ✓ Total cost estimate between \$14 to \$27.2 million
  - ✓ Continually working toward development
  - ✓ Continually securing additional grant funds

#### Fall 2021

Completed feasibility study for pedestrian bridge

#### Fall 2022

\$1.9 million Metro grant for design and permits

#### **Summer 2024**

Feasibility study connecting SW 158th & Walker to Kaiser
