Deputies Asking For Public's Help in Locating Stolen Dog

In November 2017, Washington County Sheriff's Deputies began investigating a report of two stolen American Pitbull Terriers in the City of Banks. Deputies identified Luis Bonilla, 51, as the suspect but were unable to locate the stolen dogs. Mr. Bonilla was issued a criminal citation in lieu of arrest on

November 17, 2017.

On May 9, 2018, one of the dogs was found wandering near SW 90th Ave and SW Oak St in Tigard. A citizen took the dog to a local veterinarian, who used a microchip to contact the dog's original owner. A witness reported that a Hispanic male was seen driving through the area, searching for the stolen dog. Based on statements that the unidentified man made, it is believed he may have possession of the second missing dog, Blueberry.

Blueberry is described as an approximately 1.5 year old American Pitbull Terrier. She has gray and brindle fur, with white markings on her chest and paws.
