Driver Arrested for Hit and Run and DUII

April 5, 2013—Sheriff's Deputies responded to a crash where the driver struck a girl on the sidewalk. After hitting the girl, the driver fled the scene on foot. Citizens caught the driver and detained him until deputies arrived.

On April 4, 2013, at 4:06 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a vehicle crash at SW 185th Avenue and SW Farmington Road. This is in the community of Aloha, an area of the Enhanced Sheriff's Patrol District (ESPD).

Deputies located a 2008 BMW abandoned on the sidewalk on SW Farmington Road west of SW 185th Avenue. The car had substantial front end and passenger side damage. Deputies found that two citizens were detaining Bradley Gray, 25, of Beaverton on the ground in a parking lot about 100 yards away. It was determined that Mr. Gray was the driver of the BMW. Additional deputies found Janae Doby, 17, lying on the ground close to the BMW. She was transported to a local hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Witnesses told deputies that the BMW left the roadway shortly after turning west onto SW Farmington Road. Witnesses said the BMW was "fish tailing", lost control, and struck Ms. Doby from behind as she was walking on the sidewalk. The car also caused significant damage to a power pole after striking Ms. Doby. The two men that were detaining Mr. Gray told deputies they saw him exit the BMW and run away from the crash. They said Mr. Gray offered no assistance to Ms. Doby before running away.

Sheriff's Deputies arrested Mr. Gray for DUII, Felony Hit and Run, Third Degree Assault, Reckless Endangering, and Reckless Driving. He was lodged in the Washington County Jail and held on \$20,000 bail.

The Washington County Crash Analysis Reconstruction Team assisted in the investigation. Southwest 185th Avenue was partially closed until 8:00 p.m. to gather evidence, diagram the scene, and complete the investigation.
