Interagency Drug Team Seizes Methamphetamine, Cash During Traffic Stop October 30, 2018

On Sunday, October 28, 2018, at 7 p.m., investigators with the Westside Interagency Narcotics Team conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle along Highway 219. The traffic stop was part of an ongoing narcotics investigation being conducted across multiple jurisdictions.

During the stop, Washington County Sheriff's Office K-9 Taz alerted to the presence of narcotics inside the vehicle. A subsequent search resulted in the seizure of 27 pounds of methamphetamine and \$6,700 in cash.

The driver was arrested for crimes related to the investigation. The individual is not being identified at this time due to the ongoing narcotics investigation.



Investigators were assisted at the traffic stop by troopers with the <u>Oregon State</u> <u>Police</u>.

The <u>Westside Interagency Narcotics Team</u> ("WIN") is an interagency task force comprised of personnel from the Washington County Sheriff's Office, Beaverton Police Department, Hillsboro Police Department, Oregon National Guard, and Federal Bureau of Investigation. Their mission is to target all drug traffickers in and around the Washington County area. WIN also works closely with other narcotics task forces in the area, as well as various federal agencies charged with the responsibility of enforcing drug laws.
