Deputies Seeking Public's Help Locating Suspect in Cornelius Shooting

On Saturday, August 29, 2020, at 5:22 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies serving the City of Cornelius responded to a shooting call at the intersection of South 26th Avenue and South Baseline Street. A nearby deputy was flagged down by the victim about the time the 911 call was being dispatched.

The victim told the deputy the suspect fled in a Grey 2006 Chrysler 300.

The 31-year-old male victim told the deputy that he had been at an acquaintances house in Cornelius. The acquaintance, 31-year-old Jordan Curry Brown, became angry with the victim for an unknown reason. The victim decided to leave before the argument escalated.

The victim drove about three blocks from Mr. Brown's residence and was stopped at the



stoplight when Mr. Brown pulled up alongside the victim and fired at least one shot toward the victim's head. The bullet barely missed the victim, traveling behind the driver's side headrest and exiting through the passenger side front window.

Mr. Brown's vehicle was located about an hour later at North 21st Avenue and North Holliday Street in Cornelius. The car was unoccupied. Deputies used a K9 to attempt to locate Mr. Brown, but they were unsuccessful. The car was seized and will be processed for evidence.

Deputies are asking the public's help in locating Mr. Brown. If you have seen Mr. Brown or know his whereabouts, please call 911. Mr. Brown is considered armed and dangerous and should not be approached.
