## Hillsboro Man Arrested After Attempting to Run Over Deputy

July 7, 2018 – A Hillsboro man is in custody after nearly hitting deputy while attempting to flee from a traffic stop.

On Saturday, July 07, 2018, at 1:52 a.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies conducted a traffic stop in the area of SW 185<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW Sandra Lane in the community of Aloha. Deputies were attempting to identify the driver, 30 year-old Trevor Bosworth, of Hillsboro, when he drove away from the traffic stop in a 2003 Hyundai Elantra. Mr. Bosworth's vehicle grazed a deputy as he fled the scene.

A few minutes later, deputies located Mr. Bosworth's vehicle near SW Tualatin Valley Highway and SW 170<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Mr. Bosworth refused to stop for deputies and led deputies on a pursuit into a neighborhood near SW 170<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW Sarala Street. Deputies ended the pursuit by pinning Mr. Bosworth's car with a patrol car and he was taken into custody without incident.

Thankfully, the deputy Mr. Bosworth nearly struck was not injured. A patrol car received minor damage as a result of blocking Mr. Bosworth's vehicle.

Mr. Bosworth was booked into the Washington County Jail and charged with Assault in the Second Degree, attempted Assault on a Public Safety Officer, Unlawful Use of a Weapon, Felony Attempting to Elude, Reckless Driving, Failure to Carry or Present License, and Giving False Information to a Peace Officer.
