Man Arrested for DUII Twice in Less Than Five Hours

On Wednesday, April 15, 2020, at 11:40 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies stopped a 2002 Ford F150 with a suspected DUII driver. The traffic stop took place at NW Cornelius Pass Road at NW West Union Road, and the driver was identified as Jenaro Segundo-Garcia of Beaverton. Deputies discovered Mr. Segundo-Garcia's license was revoked on a felony level and saw signs of impairment while talking to him. Mr. Segundo-Garcia cooperated with the investigation and was arrested for DUII (felony) and driving while felony revoked. At 1:00 a.m. the next morning, Mr. Segundo-Garcia provided a breath sample of .20 BAC. He received a citation in-lieu-of custody and was released to a responsible party at his home.



Less than five hours after receiving the citation in-lieu-of custody, the same deputy saw Mr. Segundo-Garcia driving a different vehicle on SW Walker Road near SW 158th Avenue. The deputy stopped the vehicle and contacted Mr. Segundo-Garcia, who still showed signs of impairment. Mr. Segundo-Garcia was arrested again and provided a second breath sample of .09 BAC.

Mr. Segundo-Garcia was lodged in the Washington County Jail on additional charges of DUII (felony) and driving while felony revoked.

Deputy McLaughlin was the arresting deputy in these cases and is a 16 year veteran with the Washington County Sheriff's Office. Deputy McLaughlin is passionate about DUII enforcement and has been throughout his career. During his tenure at the Sheriff's Office, he has been named Oregon's DUII Officer of the year two times and has arrested approximately 1,000 individuals for DUII.
