
## Man Charged with Attempted Murder, Stalking

May 21, 2021

On May 13, 2021, Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies began investigating a stalking case in the community of Aloha after a woman reported that her ex-boyfriend had tried to break into her apartment overnight.

Around the same time, the Beaverton Police Department got a phone call from an out-of-state witness who was receiving messages from the suspect. Deputies identified 21-year-old Conner Charriere as the person who tried to break into the apartment and sent the messages.

Those messages contained Mr. Charriere's detailed plan to use GPS trackers and lock picking equipment to kidnap the woman and then shoot and kill her.



Detectives were granted a warrant to search the house. Inside, they found the gun, extra ammunition, zip ties, duct tape, lock picking tools, and the packaging for a GPS tracker. Detectives later found the GPS tracker on a car connected to the victim.

On May 20, a Washington County grand jury indicted Mr. Charriere for the following charges:

- Attempted murder in the second degree
- Attempted kidnapping in the first degree (two counts)
- Attempted burglary in the first degree (four counts)
- Unlawful use of a weapon
- Stalking
- Unlawful use of a global positioning system devise
