



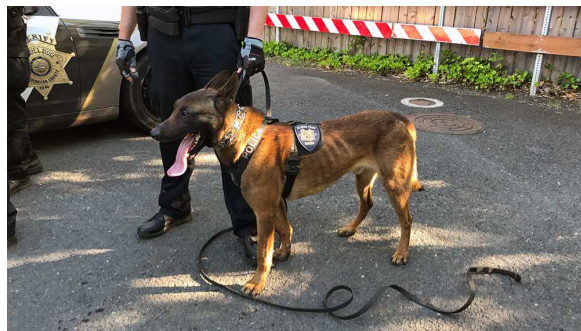

Man with Warrant Assaults Deputy, Captured During Canine Track

May 26, 2017 – A deputy was injured after being assaulted by a male with a felony warrant. The suspect fled and was later captured with the assistance of a Hillsboro Police canine unit.

On May 26, 2017, at 7:13 AM, Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a suspicious person call at Farmington Center, located at 17455 SW Farmington Road in the community of Aloha.

A deputy located the male, identified as 24-year-old Hayden Landry Davis, and learned that he had a felony warrant for his arrest. While attempting to arrest him, Mr. Davis assaulted the deputy and fled on foot.



Deputies immediately surrounded the area and as a precaution placed nearby Mountain View Middle School on lockdown, which did not have students in class today.

Hillsboro Police Officer Matt Schmidt and his partner, canine Blazer, responded to assist in searching for the suspect. The canine track led deputies to a residence bordering Mountain View Middle School, where Mr. Davis was located hiding outside.

Mr. Davis was arrested and lodged at the Washington County Jail on charges of assault on a peace officer, resisting arrest, and the felony warrant.

Deputy Ryan Tack suffered abrasions and bruises to his head and arms but will make a full recovery. He was taken to a local hospital for treatment.

According to statistics from the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI), 50,212 law enforcement officers were assaulted while performing their duties in 2015.
