Pedestrian Struck by Vehicle Dies in Aloha

November 1, 2017 – A pedestrian crossing Southwest Farmington Road was struck by a vehicle and died at the scene. Impairment and speed are not believed to be contributing factors.

On November 1, 2017, at 7:30 a.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a traffic crash involving a pedestrian on Southwest Farmington Road at Southwest 195th Avenue in the community of Aloha.

During the initial investigation, deputies learned that a pedestrian crossing Southwest Farmington Road was struck by a black Ford Escape traveling eastbound. The driver is being identified as Elias Alfaro-Izquierdo, 32, of Aloha.



Bystanders performed CPR on the pedestrian, who was later pronounced deceased at the scene. She is being identified as Victoria Garcia-Flores, 69, of Beaverton. Her family has been notified.

The driver remained onscene and is cooperating with investigators. The investigation is in its initial stages, but impairment and speed are not believed to be contributing factors.

Members of the inter-agency Washington County Crash Analysis Reconstruction Team (CART) responded and are conducting a thorough investigation.

Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue and Metro West Ambulance responded to the crash. The Oregon Department of Transportation assisted in closing Southwest Farmington Road for multiple hours, which impacted traffic and public transit in the area.
