Portland Man Arrested by Deputies after Stabbing

December 25, 2013—Washington County Deputies arrested a man who they believe stabbed an Aloha man with a knife. He was captured as he was attempting to flee the area.

On December 25, 2013, at about 12:25 a.m., Sheriff's Deputies were called to the 3900 block of SW Pinewood Way in Aloha concerning an assault. A woman called and reported that her boyfriend had stabbed her 40-year-old ex-husband in her residence. Deputies were told the boyfriend, Diubel Navarro-Gonzalez, 31, from Portland, fled the scene in a white Ford Explorer.

Multiple Sheriff's Deputies converged to the residence as others attempted to locate Mr. Navarro-Gonzalez. As deputies were at the residence, another deputy located the Explorer driven by Mr. Navarro-Gonzalez travelling eastbound through the city of Beaverton. Sheriff's Deputies, assisted by Beaverton Police, were able to stop Mr. Navarro-Gonzalez and take him into custody without further incident.



Sheriff's Deputies found a significant amount of evidence in the vehicle to connect Mr. Navarro-Gonzalez to the stabbing. The victim was transported by ground ambulance to a local hospital where he is currently listed in stable condition suffering from multiple upper body injuries.

Washington County Violent Crimes Detectives began assisting with the investigation. It is believed that the two men were at the house for a holiday celebration when an argument broke out prior to the stabbing.

Diubel Navarro-Gonzalez was lodged in the Washington County Jail and charged with Second Degree Felony Assault and Unlawful Use of a Weapon. He is held on \$250,000 bail. Additional charges are possible as the investigation continues. He will have his first court appearance on December 26, 2013, at 3:00 p.m. in the Sheriff's Office Law Enforcement Center.
