Two DUII Crashes Damage Property

December 15, 2013 – On Saturday morning, Washington County Deputies responded to a reported crash into a power pole on SW Scholls Ferry Road. On Saturday night, just before midnight another driver crashed into a house on NW Helvetia Road. Both drivers were arrested for Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicants (DUII).

Early Saturday morning, at 4:42 a.m., deputies responded to a crash on SW Scholls Ferry Road. Upon investigating the crash, deputies determined the driver, Raymundo Jiminez-Saucedo, 33, of Tualatin was traveling west towards Hillsboro after drinking at bar in Portland.



Mr. Jiminez-Saucedo drove his 2000 Suburban through a corner on SW Scholls Ferry Road, took out the roadside sign indicating a sharp corner and then slid on the muddy shoulder 219 feet before striking a telephone pole. The impact of striking the telephone pole tore off the rear axle of the Suburban. The Suburban slid another 139 feet before coming to a complete stop. Mr. Jiminez-Saucedo and his passenger were not injured.

Late Saturday night, at 11:15 p.m., deputies responded to a crash on

NW Helvetia Road. Upon investigating the crash, deputies determined the driver, Spencer Hopkins, 24, of Scappoose was traveling North on NW Helvetia Road and failed to negotiate a curve in the road. After leaving the road, Mr. Hopkins' 2005 Volkswagen Jetta traveled approximately 200 feet and struck a house. Mr. Hopkins was not injured during the crash. No one in the house was injured.

Mr. Jiminez-Saucedo was arrested for DUII, Criminal Mischief and Reckless Driving. He was lodged in the Washington County Jail with a \$500.00 bail.

Mr. Hopkins was arrested for DUII and Criminal Mischief. He was lodged in the Washington County Jail and has been released to a responsible party.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office advises citizens not to drive after the consumption of alcohol or drugs. If you must travel, the Sheriff's Office encourages citizens to prearrange a designated driver. The Washington County Sheriff's Office continues to promote safer roadways with strict enforcement of impaired drivers.
