## Update: Deputies Identify Armed Robbery Suspect After DUII Crash May 22, 2021

On Thursday, May 20, 2021, at around 1:52 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to a three-car crash on Tualatin Valley Hwy. Near SW 170<sup>th</sup> Avenue in the community of Aloha. As deputies arrived, they saw several vehicles were involved in the crash, including a 2015 Volkswagen Passat, driven by 29-year-old Kenrry Bay. While investigating the crash, deputies saw signs that led them to believe Mr. Bay may be intoxicated.

A witness to the crash told deputies that Mr. Bay had thrown a bag into nearby bushes before they arrived. Deputies located the bag and found a CO2-powered BB gun, alcohol, and narcotic paraphernalia inside. The alert deputies also recognized Mr. Bay and his vehicle from



inside. The alert deputies also recognized Mr. Bay and his vehicle from the armed robbery call at the Chevron gas station Tuesday night.

Mr. Bay was transported to a local hospital for minor injuries, where he was treated and released. The others involved in the crash were not injured.

Mr. Bay was lodged in the Washington County Jail for robbery in the second degree, driving under the influence of intoxicants, menacing, theft in the second degree and criminal driving while suspended on a misdemeanor level.

Detectives from the Sheriff's Office <u>Violent Crimes Unit</u> assisted deputies with this investigation and played a pivotal role in the apprehension of Mr. Bay. Detectives from the Violent Crimes Unit are called upon to investigate serious violent crimes such as homicides, suspicious deaths, adult sexual assaults, kidnappings, robberies, extortion, serious assaults, elder abuse, and missing persons.

On Tuesday, May 18, 2021, at around 7:30 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to an armed robbery call at the Chevron gas station located at 19165 SW Tualatin-Valley Hwy. Workers at the gas station reported that an unidentified customer robbed them with a black handgun in his waistband.

The male suspect is described as having black hair and beard, with his hair in a bun under a baseball hat. The suspect was wearing black latex gloves. He left in a newer dark blue VW Passat, headed eastbound on SW Tualatin-Valley Hwy.
