UPDATE: Search Continues for Missing Endangered Aloha Man

October 26, 2016 – Sheriff's Deputies are still seeking assistance in locating a missing Aloha man. Dane Davis has not been seen since October 17, 2016 and efforts to locate him have been unsuccessful. To date there have been no reported sightings of Mr. Davis. Deputies are concerned that Mr. Davis' medical condition is cognitive in nature and he has become lost in the past. Additionally, he is able to carry on short conversations that may lead one to believe he is not in need of assistance.

Deputies Search for Missing Endangered Man From Aloha

October 20, 2016 – Sheriff's Deputies are searching for 66-year-old Dane Davis, who has been reported missing from the community of Aloha and is possibly in danger due to health issues.

Today at 3:00 p.m., Sheriff's Deputies were called to a residence in the area of SW Cornelius Road and W Baseline Road in Aloha, concerning a report of a missing male. A caretaker reported that 66-year-old Dane Davis had not been heard from or seen in the last three days.

Deputies found Mr. Davis' residence unlocked and unoccupied, and his vehicle still in the garage. Mr. Davis' family and neighbors have not heard from him in days.

Mr. Davis is reported to have dementia, which causes him confusion and makes it difficult for him to find his way home. It is reported that Mr. Davis cannot care for himself and there are concerns that he is unable to keep himself safe.



Mr. Davis is described as a black male, 5'6" tall, heavy build, with salt and pepper facial hair (photo inset). He was last seen wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans, and is known to wear Oakland Raiders apparel. Based on past behavior, deputies believe Mr. Davis might be riding public transit, specifically MAX trains.

The Washington County Sheriff's Office Search and Rescue has been notified and deputies are enhancing their search efforts.
