## Warrants Lead to 30 Arrests in a Methamphetamine Trafficking Operation

October 16, 2015 —The Washington County Sheriff's Office, working cooperatively with many agencies, served 18 search warrants and arrested 30 individuals as part of a year-long methamphetamine investigation.

On Thursday October 15, 2015, the Washington County Westside Interagency Narcotics (WIN) Team, along with federal, state and local agencies, executed a joint search and arrest warrant operation around the metropolitan-area. The investigation began over a year ago and targeted a methamphetamine trafficking organization based in Washington County. Investigators believe the methamphetamine was transported from Mexico and distributed locally.

Investigators learned the drug-trafficking organization was widespread throughout the metropolitan-area affecting five counties. There were a total of 18 locations, including residential and commercial properties, which were part of this investigation. Of these 18 locations, 12 search warrants were executed on October 15, 2015 and two additional warrants this morning. The other four warrants were served previously.

Investigators uncovered what they believe to be a large cockfighting operation at a property in the 21400 block of SW Farmington Road. During the search warrant on October 15, 2015, investigators discovered over 1,600 chickens, most of which were used for cockfighting.

Sixty six people were investigated over the past year, of which 30 were arrested. During these search warrants and subsequent arrests, the Department of Human Services (DHS) was consulted several times concerning children in hazardous environments.

There was a vast amount of stolen property recovered from various locations including firearms and a \$3,000 bicycle.

During this investigation, there were large amounts of narcotics, firearms and cash seized to include:


- 19 firearms, of those two are confirmed stolen
- Over 26 pounds of methamphetamine
- Cocaine
- Approximately \$90,000 in cash
- Additional items pending seizure include vehicles and funds
