### Woman Arrested for Reckless Shooting

June 20, 2013 --Yesterday, Sheriff's deputies responded to a house in Aloha where the residents reported that someone shot a bullet through their exterior wall. While deputies were investigating the incident, they heard another shot from the suspect's house. After several hours a woman was arrested for discharging a firearm inside her house.

On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, at about 7:06 p.m., Sheriff's deputies responded to the 15900 block of SW Gilmore Ct. on a report of a bullet hole in the complainant's wall. This area is in the community of Aloha and is part of the Enhanced Sheriff's Patrol District (ESPD).

Deputies were investigating the bullet hole when they heard a gunshot inside the neighbor's house. They saw two bullet holes in the side of the house where they heard the shot. They later found a second bullet hole in the victim's house. Deputies decided to call out members of the Washington County Tactical Negotiations Team (TNT) and the Washington County Hostage Negotiations Team (HNT).



Most of the neighbors in the surrounding houses were evacuated. While Sheriff's deputies were evacuating the neighbors, they found another house that was hit by a bullet. No one was hit inside the house.

Deputies tried to communicate with people inside the suspect house for several hours. Eventually they were able to make contact with Alisha Mannis, 41, and HNT members were able to talk her out of the house. Sheriff's detectives interviewed Ms. Mannis and determined that she was not injured and was the most likely person to have fired the weapon.

Deputies received permission from Ms. Mannis to search the house. They initially used a robot to search the house for other people and eventually the house was completely cleared by TNT members. They did locate the weapon they believe Ms. Mannis fired.

Detectives arrested Ms. Mannis for Unlawful Use of a Weapon and Recklessly Endangering Another Person, and booked her into the Washington County Jail.

Detectives believe alcohol was a factor in tonight's incident.
