Woman Crashes Car into House, Arrested for DUII

On New Year's Day at about 11:30 p.m., Sheriff's Deputies responded to a call in the community of Aloha where a car crashed through the wall of a house. The driver was later arrested for DUII.

On January 01, 2016, at about 11:30 p.m., Washington County Sheriff's Deputies were called to a crash in the 4600 block of SW Stoddard Drive in Aloha. Someone crashed their 2003 Infinity M45 through the garage wall of a single family house. No one was injured inside the house. The driver left on foot.





Deputies investigating the case determined that before the car hit the side of the house, it struck a fence in a neighbor's yard and ran over some pots in another neighbor's yard. Deputies were able to locate the driver of the car at her house down the street. She had gone home to solicit help from her boyfriend and was not attempting to avoid arrest. She was not hurt in the crash. Yanmanaa

Walleman, 43, of Aloha, told deputies she was driving the car that crashed into the house, but was not sure how it happened.

After their investigation, deputies arrested Ms. Walleman for DUII (alcohol), Reckless Driving, and three counts of Criminal Mischief in the Second degree. She was booked into the Washington County Jail. The Washington County Sheriff's Office continues to remind drivers to take another form of transportation if they have been drinking, smoking marijuana, or using any prescription or nonprescription drugs that may cause impairment.

Last year Washington County Sheriff's Deputies arrested 1016 DUII drivers, with 95 arrests in the month of December.
