


### What's recyclable and what's in the mix?

**Recycling:** means any process by which solid waste materials are transformed into new products in a manner that the original products may lose their identity.

#### Why is it on the list?

- Strong end market
- Can be separated from other materials
- Does not impact sorting equipment
- Makes environmental sense
- Enough material to sort for
- Ability for generators to identify and prepare properly




**Examples**: Plastic film, Styrofoam, Plastic clamshells, plastic lids

**Examples**: Paper, cardboard, plastic bottles, plastic buckets, plastic tubs, metal.

### Engagement to Date

- Seeking input from and coordinating approach with other local governments (Beaverton & Hillsboro).
- Engaging in multiple discussions with the Washington County Hauler Association – potential program elements.
- Soliciting community member input through community designed engagement opportunities and survey – will help inform interest in an expanded recycling collection program. Survey ends December 17.





# Staff's Recommended Approach

- Respond to community interest and provide opportunity for expanded recycling collection services.
- Include expanded recycling collection services in existing regulatory framework (Regulatory Approach A – Hauler Collection Program or Sub-contract).
- Solicit input from GRAC and community members to develop program elements in coordination with certificated service providers.
